As Trustees we have kept in mind the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit. We have aimed to promote, sustain and increase individual and collective knowledge and understanding of early music.

The focus of our activities remains the organisation of early music workshops catering for a range of interests and abilities. The workshops are all led by highly-regarded specialist tutors.

We welcome everyone who wishes to come to our workshops. We are especially keen to attract younger people. Our fees for workshops and membership are modest, and concessions are available for families and students.

We seek to provide for those who are experienced in singing and playing early music and wish to explore more complex areas, and for those who have little experience but want to know more.

We organise occasional concerts associated with the workshops, so that those who enjoy listening to early music but do not sing or play are also catered for.


We offer funding to other organisations in our area for innovative ventures that are aimed at increasing the public appreciation of, and participation in, early music.

We publish an entertaining and informative quarterly newsletter and maintain an attractive and useful website, with links to other organisations, information about workshops and much else of interest to members and the wider public. ## Achievements and performance

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### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We organised seven workshops during the year; four for singers, two for singers and instrumentalists, and one for bowed strings. This was an 'outreach project' to introduce players of modern instruments to Baroque techniques.

The music we studied included works from the medieval era, Tudor songbooks and Renaissance Italy and Portugal. We also explored music from the Baroque period and Enlightenment Rome. Our venues ranged from Monmouth to Shropshire

Our medieval workshop was followed by a dinner and a recital by the tutor using live-loop technology.

From our surplus funds we supported the inaugural workshop of the Wales Early Music Forum Cymru, held in Sennybridge near Brecon - a day of Tudor music.

We funded a free recorder concert for children and families as part of the Worcester Early Music Festival and supported the inaugural concert of The Linarol Consort at Discoed in Radnorshire.
