To advance, improve, develop and maintain public education in, and appreciation of, the art and science of early music in all its aspects including the presentation of public concerts and recitals.</p>

As Trustees we keep in mind the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit. We aim to promote, sustain and increase individual and collective knowledge and understanding of early music.

The focus of our activities remains the organisation of early music workshops catering for a range of interests and abilities. The workshops are all led by highly-regarded specialist tutors.

We welcome everyone who wishes to come to our workshops. We are especially keen to attract younger people. Our fees for workshops and membership are modest, and concessions are available for families and students.

We seek to provide for those who are experienced in singing and playing early music and wish to explore more complex areas, and for those who have little experience but want to know more.

We organise occasional concerts associated with the workshops, so that those who enjoy listening to early music but do not sing or play are also catered for.

We offer funding to other organisations in our area for innovative ventures that are aimed at increasing the public appreciation of, and participation in, early music.

We publish an entertaining and informative quarterly newsletter and maintain an attractive and useful website, with links to other organisations, information about workshops and much else of interest to members and the wider public. We have a Facebook page. We also send regular emails to remind members about workshops and to inform them of other events directly related to BEMMF.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We organised six workshops during the year: three for singers, two for singers and instrumentalists and one for instrumentalists and dancers. One workshop for singers had to be postponed until 2021 because of the Covid19 restrictions.

We selected venues over a wide geographical area including Monmouthshire, Gloucestershire and Shropshire as well as Herefordshire and Powys, in order to offer as many people as possible an opportunity to participate.

The dance/instrumentalist workshop offered a unique experience for participants, being led by three tutors – the musical director and two professional dancers – and we used some of our surplus funds to subsidise this.

We inserted into our newsletter, at no charge, a flier for an Early Music Concert organised by Music in New Radnor. This was a means of assisting them to promote a local early music trio.

We offered support for the subsistence costs of a group of music students attending Early Music at Discoed, a weekend course for singers and instrumentalists.

We made donations to the charity of choice of our hosts for two of our workshops, in lieu of fee for the hire of the venues.
